Caloundra Community Hall Internet Connection Speed Just Got Turbo Charged!

The Sunshine Coast Council gave permission to have the Flash Fibre equipment installed at the Caloundra Community Hall, and the Club paid for the equipment and installation. The Caloundra meeting venue Internet connections speed is now faster than the NBN. That is correct, after a lot of effort and researching by the committee on alternative Internet connection services, a new Internet connection system has been installed at the Caloundra Community hall.

It took two men from Flash Fibres, around four hours to install and test everything. Now the Caloundra Community hall has one of the fastest Internet connections on the Sunshine Coast. This could improve with time, as the system is fine tuned.

Well 2016 was another great year.

There was great team work by all the committee members again this year. The administrative tasks carried out by Jean Lear, Treasurer Heather Atkinson and Secretary Jae Tunnell play a very important role in keeping the Club running smoothly. The Club magazine editor Judy Smith puts that extra effort into the Club magazine.

It is only through the great team effort of all the volunteers and committee members that everything works as well as it does. The Club is financially sound, and has a solid membership.

We managed to get some excellent publicity for the Club at the beginning of the year, with a number of articles in the Sunshine Coast Daily, including a couple of full page articles.

The Club meetings were well attended and everything ran smoothly. Well almost everything. At times, getting good Internet connections has been an issue at both meeting venues.

Unfortunately, equipment failures and Internet services have occasionally created Internet connection issues. The volunteers who maintain the networks, Nevil Eyre, George Lupsa, and myself have been very aware of these issues, and have worked on solutions at Buderim and Caloundra.

At the beginning of the year at Caloundra hall, the Club installed two ADSL 2+ Internet services to try and improve Internet connection speeds, only to find that the Caloundra hall telephone connection line quality was dramatically restricting performance. Efforts were put into finding a solution, different modems and network configurations were tried only to come to the

conclusion that a new connection system was needed, if connection speeds were to be improved.

As a results of those efforts the Caloundra hall now has the new very high speed connection.

The networks the Club has set up at Buderim and Caloundra are very big and complex. Their complexity is comparable to a big corporate network set-up. These networks have the added complexity of having to have the equipment turned off and packed away and then re-installed every meeting! There will be network issues at times, because these are complex systems. Also the volunteers are restricted to the four hours during meetings to work on maintenance, and problem solving.

The remodeling at the Goodlife Centre at Buderim hopefully will be complete by mid February, and the Club meeting routine will be back to normal. Before going to Buderim meetings in February check the Club bulletins for updates, in case of construction delays.

Membership numbers are very important to the Club. Healthy membership numbers allow the Club to keep service costs and membership fees low. I ask all members to pick up membership applications from the desk at the Club meetings, and hand them out to friends and relatives and encourage them to join. Let them know how great the Club is, sing it's praises!

Printing an Open Office Calc (Spreadsheet) onto one page.

If you have an Open Office Calc document that extends over one page and you would like to print it on one page this will make it possible.

With the Calc document open -

Format > Page > Sheet tab > Scale > Scaling Mode > Fit print range(s) to width/height > Set the width to 1 and height to 1 > Click OK

This can be done whether the page is in Portrait or Landscape Orientation. Suggest expanding the page margins to get the output as large as possible when starting the project.

Adding an Icon to a Toolbar and Customising the Toolbar in Open Office.

When Open Office programme is installed a number of icons are displayed on the toolbars as default.

A click on the down arrow at the end of a toolbar gives a drop down list -

- Visible Buttons,
- Customise Toolbar,
- Dock Toolbars,
- Dock All Toolbars,
- Lock Toolbar position,
- Close Toolbar.

Beside the name - Visible Buttons is a side arrow which will show a list of icons and the name of their function that could be on this toolbar. The icons that are already displayed on the toolbar will be shown by a grey background to the icon. Click on any of the icons not already greyed to add them to the toolbar. Delete any not required by clicking on the icon.

It is known that there is generally more than one way to carry out functions on a computer. Check through the icons available as there may be functions there that would help with work being done by just clicking on an icon on the toolbar.

To add a button to the list of Visible Buttons -

1. Choose Tools – Customise, and click on the Toolbars tab
2. In the Toolbars box, select the toolbar you want to change
3. Click Add Commands, select the new command, then click Add.

4. If you want, you can rearrange the Commands list by selecting a command name and clicking Move Up and Move Down.
5. Click OK

NBN and professionally monitored medical alarm systems

With the NBN now being connected in many areas of the Sunshine Coast, if you use an alarm system this information may be of use to you.

It is expected that these services remain functional when connected to the NBN and that there is no interruption to your medical alarm service.

Alarm systems that have been installed recently will already be compatible with the NBN. These later systems have sim cards installed and in the event of a blackout your alarm equipment will automatically transfer to a mobile service. This is provided by your alarm system provider, it has nothing to do with your mobile service.

In the event that you may have an older system that is not compatible with the NBN, your provider will upgrade your equipment.

What to do:

As the NBN is being rolled out to many areas of the Sunshine Coast, if you have a medical alarm system:

- **Call your equipment service provider** and check that your equipment will work with the NBN.
- **Register your medical alarm** with the NBN Medical Register.

- **When you receive a letter from NBN** advising that NBN is being connected to your house, if you have not already notified NBN that you have an alarm system call the number on the letter and let them know the type of alarm and service provider so that they can check before they arrive to connect the new system.

Reviews

Review: Apple iPhone 7 Plus Gadget Guy January 2017

The iPhone 7 Plus is, of course, Apple's large screen version of the iPhone. Unsurprisingly, it is in many ways identical, or at least very similar, albeit lower cost and smaller iPhone 7. So rather than coming up with new words to say the same things, I'm only going to talk about the differences here, plus perhaps one or two more things that should be highlighted. Read everything else in the detailed review, see link at end.

Features:

Difference number one is of course size. The iPhone 7 Plus is a touch thicker (up by 0.2mm to 7.3mm – see if you can tell the difference!), and a fair bit wider (10.8mm to 77.9mm) and longer (19.9mm to 158.2mm). And it weighs quite a bit more: 188 grams vs 138 grams.

That increase allows two significant differences: a larger screen and a larger battery. The other major difference is the rear camera.

The screen is up from 4.7 inches to 5.5 inches, and scores full HD resolution (1080 by 1920 pixels, versus 750 by 1334). Even with the greater real estate, the pixel density has increased from 326 to 401 pixels per inch.

The iPhone 7 Plus has the same 12 megapixel f/1.8 camera that's in the iPhone 7, but has a second camera right next to it. Also with 12 megapixels, this offers a maximum f/2.8 aperture and can provide an optical zoom of 2x. Video up to 4K at 30 frames per second is available.

Conclusion:

If you like the Apple ecosystem, and want a bigger screen, longer battery life or better camera than the standard iPhone 7, then the iPhone 7 Plus is for you.

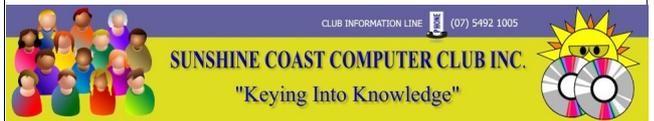
