The Polar Vortexes & Grand Solar Minima - Peter Daley

The Polar Vortexes & Grand Solar Minima information below, was added to the Earth Changes article <http://sccc.org.au/archives/10705>

after an inquiry from a person in America about Polar Vortexes & Earth Changes.

I hope it makes it easier to understand some of the dynamic weather and environmental changes that will occur as the Sun's Total Solar Irradiance (**TSI**) drops, and the Sun goes into a quiet phase.

Historical evidence tells us that when the Sun goes into a Grand Solar Minima, it will create dramatic climate and earth changes. These Sun induced changes will be in addition to the climate change already created by human industrial activity. You need to do research and start preparing for this. Study what happened during the Dalton Minima (years 1790 1820), or the more extreme Maunder Minima (years 1645 1715), to get an understanding of what could occur.

Quote from NASA Researcher:

"We see a cooling trend," says Martin Mlynczak of NASA's Langley Research Center. "High above Earth's surface, near the edge of space, our atmosphere is losing heat energy. If current trends continue, it could soon set a Space Age record for cold."

During a Grand Solar Minima the upper atmosphere becomes more charged from very high energy galactic and intergalactic cosmic particles hitting the earth's upper atmosphere.

In this high altitude balloon testing chart from spaceweather.com <http://www.spaceweather.com/> you can see that cosmic ray intensity has hit historic high levels in 2018.

One of the effects of increased cosmic rays is the

upper atmosphere high speed jet streams at the North and South Poles start to wander more frequently from their normal relatively stable course.

As the Northern Hemisphere jet stream wanders South, it draws cold Arctic air with it, and on the other side of this much warmer tropical air can be drawn from the tropics much further North.

In this image you can see what a stable jet stream looks like compared to a polar vortex event.

During a polar vortex event, a country as large as the US could have part of the country experiencing a heat wave, while the other part will be experiencing record cold temperatures.

This image shows how a solar vortex can create enormous temperature differences. Where the very hot and very cold air masses meet, you will see extreme weather events occur.

Grand Solar Minima are historically associated with dramatic weather events. Examples are massive hail events, a year or month's worth of rain falling in a day, record snow, record hot and cold temperatures, plus way above the normal number of lightning strikes during storms. Tornadoes can appear in regions where you would not expect to see them. Deserts can see massive flooding or even snow, while other areas that are normally wet can experience droughts.

These earth changes happen so quickly and dramatically that farmers can't cope. This leads to massive crop losses, as we can see presently occurring on the worldwide crop loss map below. Click the map markers to get report details. These worldwide crop losses have been created by rapid and dynamically changing weather conditions, cold, heat, flooding, snow, hail and drought etc., over the last 12 months. As we go deeper into a Grand Solar Minima, crop losses will intensify, because of an increasing number of volcanic eruptions and earthquakes that are also triggered by the increasing cosmic rays intensity.

World Crop Loss Map

Click on the map markers to get the full crop loss reports. There are around three times as many markers on this map now, compared to eight months ago.

History of Sunshine Coast Computer Club Inc (Part Two) - Jean Lear

Times have changed a bit. Recorded in Minutes of 3 April 1995 - "Tea and coffee were again available for 50c a cup including two biscuits. This will now be a permanent thing but remain on the honour system" It was later proposed at a Committee meeting on 12 October 1995 that a \$1 entry fee would be introduced 'as the honesty system was being abused by some' - Did not say if the two biscuit restriction was lifted!

At the 3 April 1995 meeting, "Windows 95 was introduced – the only copy on the Coast. This was a Beta version as the official launch date is still not set."

Initially membership fees were all due on a set date each year but the constitution was amended to cover the present system where membership is for a period of twelve months from date of joining and renewing on that date.

The Club began as "Sunshine Coast Computer Users Group" otherwise known as SCCUG.

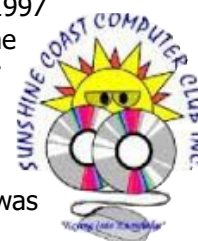
At a Committee meeting held on 10 December 1996 discussion was initiated on a possible name change for the Group. According to the minutes "It was felt that a more business like name would not only avoid parochialism, but might make it easier to obtain grants from Local, State and Commonwealth Governments. It

was decided to announce a competition for a suitable name. Members received a questionnaire about changes to the Club name so the Committee could finalize the matter."

The Committee narrowed the list to the following four -

- Suncoast Computer Association
- Suncoast Computer Users Association
- Sunshine Coast Computer Association
- Sunshine Coast Computer Users Association

At the monthly meeting on 2 June 1997 the members present voted to rename the Club as "Sunshine Coast Computer Club". That meeting also voted to Incorporate the Club so when this was approved as was required by Government regulations the 'Inc' was added to the name.

The Polar Vortexes & Grand Solar Minima - Peter Daley

There is a lot of scientific discussion at present on how extreme this Grand Solar Minima will be. Will it be similar to a milder *Dalton*

https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Dalton_Minimum (years 1790 1820), or more like the extreme *Maunder* Minima

https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Maunder_Minimum years 1645 1715). There is the possibility that this Grand Solar Minima will be even more extreme than both of these recent past Grand Solar Minima. The strength or weakness of the next eleven year solar cycle will provide an indication. The number of Sun spots define what is a minimum or maximum for a solar cycle.

Most governments are not up to speed on this new dynamic, and this will lead to a lot of people dying and worldwide instability because there have not been significant preparations put in place. We know what happened in the past during Grand Solar Minima. It is all there in plain sight in the historical record for anyone who takes the time to do some basic research on the subject.

For Users of Skype

After some delays, Microsoft is finally going to kill Skype Classic starting on 1 Nov 18.

Not everyone will have to upgrade from Skype Classic to Skype 8 immediately, but, if Microsoft chooses to upgrade you, you will not have a choice. Even if you dodge the initial wave on 1 Nov 18, Microsoft will upgrade you within the a few weeks. If you are a Skype user, you will have to upgrade from Skype 7 to Skype 8 or stop using it. Users will need to be cautious as there are two versions - a 'modern' app with somewhat limited features that comes with Windows 10, and a 'desktop' version with more features for earlier Windows versions, Mac, and Linux. The download link for this is well-hidden, so see Peter Dodwell at a meeting if you need it. If you and your Skype contacts are not happy with Skype 8 for some reason, your only option will be switching to a competing chat application. Discord and Telegram are pretty popular, as is Facebook Messenger.

Scam Involving E mail Accounts

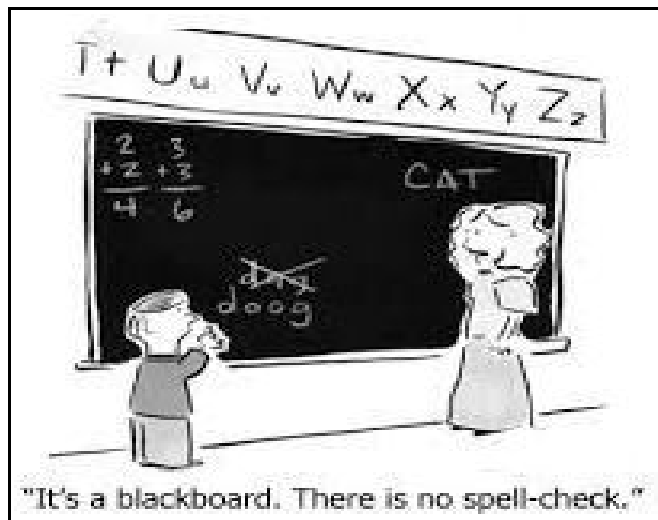

A new scam has been recently reported. Victims have received an email from hackers saying that they have cracked their email account. As proof, they have supplied the correct password for the account. The message goes on to say that they have planted a Trojan on the computer which allows them to spy on the victim. The hackers claim to have incriminating porn pictures, and demand a large sum to keep them quiet, otherwise they will publish them.

This is a scam and a bluff. Here is how it works - At some point in the past, one visited a website and created a user account using your email and password. Later, real hackers compromised the site, then downloaded the database of user accounts (including your name, email, and password used on the site). They then used this information to mass email all the people in the database with the same scam message - just like the one described. In order to legitimize their "masterful hacking techniques" they supply you with your email password. This is icing on the cake and will frighten most people into believing the next line, where they claim to have planted a Trojan on your computer capable of spying on your every move Now that you know how the scam operates, you can safely ignore the message.

But do change your passwords on all the sites you visit, making sure they are strong and unique. Never, ever

use the same password on more than one site - otherwise hackers (and scammers) can use this information to gain access to other sites, or send you scam emails like the one mentioned. If you use different passwords on all the sites you visit, you severely limit the potential attack vector.

24th October 2018 - "Colonizing Experiment in Surveillance Capitalism": Privacy Expert Resigns From Google-Backed Smart City Project Over Surveillance Concerns

A privacy expert tasked with protecting personal data within a Google-backed smart city project has resigned as her pro-privacy guidelines would largely be ignored by participants.

"I imagined us creating a Smart City of Privacy, as opposed to a Smart City of Surveillance," Ann Cavoukian, the former privacy commissioner of Ontario, wrote in a resignation letter to Google sister company Sidewalk Labs.

In an October op-ed, Balsillie describes smart cities as the new battlefield for big tech and warned that the commercialization of IP and data within the city would mean that personal information would just be another target of corporate digital-gold mining.

Energy provider AGL has warned of a hoax emails in circulation with the subject 'AGL electricity bill'. The email includes a bill for electricity with a due date.

Anyone could receive this email, even if you are not an AGL customer.

These types of emails are common scams that often pretend to be from a large organization you trust and can be sent via email, SMS, instant messaging or social media platforms.

AGL advises that all of its electricity bills will:

- come from this address: agl@energy.ag.com.au
- include the supply address and account number

Any emails that do not include these details may be hoax and should be deleted, without clicking on any links or attachments.
